When Mr. Lincoln arrived in Washington as President-elect, it was a sleepy Southern proslavery village with mud tracks for streets, a canal for a sewer and one hospital that treated around 200 patients a year. The impact of the Civil War was traumatic. Encore Learning invites you to visit the Federal District of 1861-65 through photographs, maps, and art objects of the era, and, by discussion, to explore the ways the War served as a catalyst to the evolving Capital city.
