Historic Mansion Decorated for the Holidays

Join Encore Learning for a docent-led tour of historic Tudor Place, home to six generations of Martha Washington's descendants, from 1805 to 1983. Tudor Place displays decorative arts and artifacts which include a Washington Collection larger than any outside Mount Vernon. This urban estate in Georgetown hosted illustrious figures including the Marquis de Lafayette, General Robert E. Lee, President Andrew Jackson, Henry Clay, John C. Calhoun, and Daniel Webster, among others. The house will be decorated for the holiday season as it might have looked in the 1800s.

Please arrive by 11:15 am so entry fees can be paid before our 11:30 tour. The entrance to the house is off of 31st St. NW just north of Q St.

A wait list will be maintained and all registrants will be contacted by the event coordinator via phone or email at least one week prior to the event.

Tudor Place is located at 1644 31st St. NW in Georgetown, between Q and R Streets.

There is limited free on-street parking available (two-hour time limit).

Metro Buses run along Wisconsin Avenue and along Q Street.

The nearest Metro stop is Dupont Circle on the Red Line, followed by a 10-block walk along Q Street or a Metrobus ride along P Street into Georgetown.
