

Dr. Dorothy Boulding Ferebee, Civil Rights Pioneer

Judge Diane Kiesel will discuss her book, *She Can Bring Us Home*, which tells the extraordinary story of Dr. Dorothy Ferebee, civil rights and public health leader, to a new generation. During the Great Depression and at a time when blacks faced Jim Crow segregation, Dr. Ferebee was the media darling of the then thriving African American press. Dr. Ferebee, a native of Norfolk, was sought after to advise presidents and Congress on Civil rights matters and to assist foreign governments on Public Health issues. She was a household name in black America for forty years.

Judge Diane Kiesel is currently an Acting Supreme Court Justice on the New York State Trial Court. She is also the author of *Domestic Violence: Law, Policy, and Practice*.
