Music in the Life of President Lincoln is a 40 minute video featuring the Virginia Chamber Orchestra led by Music Director David Grandis, Robert Aubry Davis as narrator and moderator, soprano Meghan McCall, the Alexandria Choral Society, the Grand Contraband Jubilee Singers, and videotaped in-studio discussion with authors Betty Monkman and Elizabeth Smith Brownstein.
