


Christine Negroni will speak on

The Crash Detectives: Investigating the World's Mysterious Air Disasters

Author Christine Negroni, will explain her theory about what happened to the Malaysia airliner that disappeared on a flight to Beijing in 2014 (MH 370). In way of an interview she will also discuss with her 'co-pilot' Tim White, retired brigadier general USAF, PhD, how accident investigations make aviation safer by detecting failures in humans and machines. Exploring unsolved air crashes from Amelia Earhart to MH 370, Negroni will talk about the common themes in many aviation mysteries and what has been learned to modernize pilot training, airline operations, and airplane designs.

Christine Negroni is a journalist specializing in air travel and aviation for *The New York Times*, ABC News, *Air & Space Magazine* and many other news organizations. She began her career in broadcasting and became a network correspondent at CBS News and CNN. After covering the crash of TWA Flight 800 for CNN, she went on to write her first book *Deadly Departure*.

Retired Brigadier General Tim White, known as Tim, is the former acting director of strategic communication during operation Iraqi freedom and was the original anchorman of *America Today* seen in 107 countries on World Net television. He is also a historian and a resident of Arlington
