El Greco in Washington Area Collections



400th Year Anniversary Celebration of the Artist's Death

Four of the National Gallery's paintings by El Greco have recently been returned to the Museum by Spain, to which they were loaned for the celebration of the 400th year anniversary of the artist's death. In the current exhibit, these works are united with others from the National Collection and from Dumbarton Oaks, the Phillips Collection and the Walters Art Museum (Baltimore).

After early work in his native Greece, and, later, in Venice, El Greco settled in Toledo, Spain, where he produced paintings, by commission, that feature elongated figures and ambiguous treatments of space, thus creating a transcendent art that conveys the fervor and spirituality of Counter Reformation Spain.
