The Arlington House at Arlington National Cemetery

Membership must be valid through the event date to register. This free event is limited to 20 registrants.

A National Park Ranger will lead this private tour of the Arlington House (the Robert E. Lee Memorial) which was the residence of Robert E. Lee and his family before the Civil War.

Come see this Greek Revival Style Mansion with its majestic views of the Potomac River, as well as the Lee Family Museum and adjacent Enslaved Quarters and hear the colorful stories they have to tell.

In late spring 2017, the Arlington House will be closed for extensive renovation and tours will be suspended for an undetermined period of time.

The Arlington House (formerly the Lee-Custis Mansion) is located on the grounds of Arlington National Cemetery. The address is 321 Sherman Dr. in the Fort Myer neighborhood of Arlington VA 22201.

Carpooling is strongly advised. Arrangements will be made for carpool drivers to clear Arlington Cemetery security so as to be able to drive their carpools directly up to the mansion and park in the employees' parking lot adjacent to Arlington House. Information on how to contact the event coordinator for carpool requests will be included on your email receipt after you have registered.
