This 200 year old house, tucked away behind the US Capitol, was once home to the Secretary of the Treasury before being burned down by the British in 1812 and then rebuilt. Home to Alice Paul, a prominent leader of the Suffrage movement, it was purchased by the National Women's Party in 1929. This Museum houses the single largest collection of Women's Suffrage memorabilia in the country, and our visit to the this National Monument will include a National Park Ranger guided tour of the property, as well as time to visit their gift shop.

Take Metro to Capitol South (Blue, Orange and Silver Lines). Exit metro onto 1st Street NE towards the Capitol for four blocks to Constitution Avenue. Cross street, turn right, and walk past the Dirksen and Hart Senate Office Buildings. Museum is on the corner of Constitution Ave & 2nd St NE. The entrance to the Museum is on 2nd Street.
